

This model was made slightly reduced in scale of about 19" x 24" as the extant eagle plaques are quite large at 25" wide and over 31" tall.

Coming this summer I should have molds finished of my four Public School gargoyles done, the models were completed in December-early January. They are still in a developmental stage as to materials and the like.

I am also pleased to mention that I am now an *art scholarship recipient of Iowa Central Community College*- where I am attending sculpture classes to refine and expand my work into the human face.
