Coming this summer I should have molds of my four Public School gargoyles going, the models were completed in December-early January and I have been so swamped I haven't had a chance to work on the molds for them. These are full bodied and modelled after extant gargoyles on the former PS 168 in Harlem. Here below is a photo of the four in the studio, each has a distinct personality.



Individual photos of each are linked to below, they are designated as 168-R, 169-R, 170-R and 171-R.

I have had quite a few people ask me about these and when they will be available, I am going to make the mold of 169-R first very shortly, so if you have an interest in one or more, be sure to let me know which and the one with the most requests will be done next.

These average around 25-26" long, and these will also want to ship in wood crates. I have not priced these yet.
